#### First Reading: Isaiah 43:18-21

# Second Reading: Romans 8:14-17, 22-27

For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

We know that the whole creation is groaning together and suffering labor pains up until now. And it's not only the creation. We ourselves who have the Spirit as the first crop of the harvest also groan inside as we wait to be adopted and for our bodies to be set free. We were saved in hope. If we see what we hope for, that isn't hope. Who hopes for what they already see? But if we hope for what we don't see, we wait for it with patience.


In the same way, the Spirit comes to help our weakness. We don't know what we should pray, but the Spirit himself pleads our case with unexpressed groans. The one who searches hearts knows how the Spirit thinks, because he pleads for the saints, consistent with God's will.

All: Praise to You, O Christ.



Leader: Gather your people across regions, nations, and lands. Root our common life in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, and by your Spirit bind us together with all the saints who have gone before us. God, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

Leader: In your mercy, O God, respond to these prayers, and renew us by your life-giving Spirit; through Jesus Christ, our Savior.

All: Amen.

#### Renewal of Ordination Vows

Bishop: Dear friends, hear the words that our Lord Jesus Christ spoke to his first servants, the blessed Apostles: "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven" (John 20:21-23).

By God's call and the laying on of hands, you have been set apart to be stewards of God's grace in the ministry of Word and Sacrament or the ministry of Word and Service.

I exhort you always to be mindful of how great a treasure has been entrusted to you. The flock over which the Holy Spirit has made us shepherds or leaders is made up of Christ's sheep, purchased with his blood. May we never tire in seeking to bring those committed to our care to increased faith and knowledge of God and to fullness of life in Christ. As we shall give account before the Lord in the great day of his appearing, now in the presence of Christ and God's holy people; do you recommit yourself to the various ministries of our Lord Jesus Christ to which you have been called under the pastoral oversight of your bishop?

#### All: I do, with God's help.

The bishop addresses the Ordained Ministers of Word and Sacrament:

Bishop: Will you who are ordained continue to preach and teach the Word of God in accordance with the Confessions of our Church, and to administer the Holy Sacraments after the ordinance of Christ, and to serve all people?

#### All: I will, with God's help.

The bishop addresses the Ordained Ministers of Word and Service:

Bishop: Will you adorn the teaching of our God and Savior by a holy life and conversation?

I will, with God's help. Will you bear faithful witness before the world, that God's love may be seen in all you do?

#### All: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: And now, as your bishop, I, too, before God and you, re-dedicate myself and reaffirm the promises that I made when I was ordained. I ask for your prayers.

All: Almighty God, who has given us the will to do these things, bless us with the faith, strength and determination to accomplish them. Amen.

For thine is the kingdom,


