

Synod Council Highlights—September 14-16, 2023 Retreat & Meeting

The council approved:

- Bishop Tim's sabbatical for December '23, January & February '24.
- a synod Land Acknowledgement, including versions for use at synod meetings, and a version to be used in an upcoming synod film project.
- the closure of Arbol de Vida, Durham, as of October 31.
- the closure of Gloria Dei, Salisbury, as of November 13.
- the distribution of the account balance of Christ, Winston-Salem, using the Holy Closure guidelines.
- George Moretz to serve the remainder of the term of Pedie King (now deceased) on the Board of Trustees of Lenoir-Rhyne University.
- Agape+Kure Beach Ministries to hold a synod wide capital campaign for 2027-2029.
- LSC board members: Hoang Nguen, Kaye Leonard, Rick Herman, and Sylvia Flack.
- the constitutions of five congregations.
- Jody Laffon, Pastor Phil Thorsen to continue their appointment on the Legal Committee.
- Pastor Tony Bradshaw to continue his appointment on the Audit Committee.
- Bernard Robinson and Company to continue as our auditors.
- giving the synod staff and finance committee the authority to negotiate the selling and executing the deed of the property of Gloria Dei, Salisbury.
- rostered ministers' transitions.
