FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 5:12-15

Observe the sabbath day and keep it holy, as the Lord your God commanded you. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work you, or your son or your daughter, or your male or female slave, or your ox or your donkey, or any of your livestock, or the resident alien in your towns, so that your male and female slave may rest as well as you. Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the Lord your God brought you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm; therefore the Lord your God commanded you to keep the sabbath day.

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you.

GOSPEL: Mark 2:23—3:6

The Holy Gospel according to Mark, the second chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.

One sabbath [Jesus] was going through the grainfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?" And he said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions." Then he said to them, "The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath."

Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him. And he said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come forward." Then he said to them, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.

Together we remember in the language of our heart us the prayer that Jesus taught us:

READING: Romans 8: 31-38

What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? As it is written:

"For your sake we face death all day long;

About the Paraments

The paraments used in worship were handwoven by Pastor Sharon Schulze for Our Savior Lutheran in Durham. Upon Our Savior's closure, the beauty of these paraments will live on in the NC Synod as a reminder of that congregation's legacy. The green paraments' double weave pattern creates a double-thickness cloth. On one side, a light border surrounds darker rectangles. The off-center cross motif reminds is of our call to reach out and share Good News with everyone we meet.

Based on Romans 8:35-39 with Emphasis on v. 37

We are more than victorious through Jesus' love in us!

I placed a heart at the center where the cross-pieces of the cross converge. The heart and cross stand out in bold contrast from the chaotic background which represents all that is listed in verses 38-39 of the created order, up and down, that could pull us away from God's love.

If you look carefully at the cross, you will see that the upper cross-piece differs from the others. It is bordered by three single strands of jute with a single strand in the middle coming down as if from heaven to touch the heart. On closer inspection, one might see the outward strands curve like hands to caress or bless the heart as does the love of the Creator for the Son.

The other cross-pieces are bordered by braided strands of jute. This represents the participation of our involvement in the cross of Christ and of the strength that we, as God's beloved, receive as we work together as God's people.

The three single strands within each of the cross-pieces going out and down from the heart represent the powerful work and direction of the Father, Son, and Spirit in the lives of all believers. The glitter that can be detected in these cross pieces spread out from the glitter of the heart of Christ and indicates the love and power that we are privileged to carry in our mission for the world!
