

COMMISSIONING OF NC SYNOD AUTHORIZED LAY MINISTERS

After prayerful consideration, we certify that: Walt Allen, Mallory Allen, Tony Lippard, Deanna Deaton have been prepared to work as Lay Preachers in the NC Synod. Our Lord, who came among us as a servant, calls us to faith and a life of loving service to our neighbor. You stand among us as those called to render a particular service, a gift from God to inspire us to love and good works.

A reading from Romans: "Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully."

A reading from 1 Peter: "Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever."

Will you assume this ministry in the confidence that it comes from God? Will you be diligent in your study of the Holy Scriptures and faithful in prayer? Will you trust in God's care, seek to grow in love for those you serve, strive for excellence in your skills, and adorn the gospel of God with a godly life? (Candidate) I will, and I ask God to help me.

Assembly rise as able.

People of God, will you receive these lay preachers into this ministry as those sent to serve in the church of Jesus Christ? Will you pray for them, help and honor them for their work's sake, and strive to live together in the unity of Christ in all things?

We will, and we ask God to help us.

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With the whole church, we confess our faith: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the Tresurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

I commission you as Lay Preachers in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Grant them joy and a spirit of bold trust, that their work may stir up each of us to a life of faithfulness. Strengthen and bless them that they may boldly proclaim the good news of salvation and reconciliation. Fill them with wisdom and patience, with love, and with faithfulness to your word, that they may with gladness preach, teach, comfort, and guide your people to maturity in Christ Jesus through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior, and Lord. **Amen.**

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Merciful God, you took on our flesh and lived among us. You know what it is like to be human. Help us, Lord! Help us to tend to the poor. Help us to serve the imprisoned. 


Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:
